LINE THROW CLARIFICATION

Senior division

1. Team members registered only as a victim in the Line Throw event must be included within the team's maximum number of competitors. A team may consist of a minimum of one individual and a maximum of four males and a maximum of four females.
2. Teams that register for the Canadian Lifeguard Championship with only one male or one female team member may enter the Line Throw event. The single male or female may request a victim be provided by the host organizing committee.

Teams who require this service must make this known when registering prior to the championship, in accordance with the procedures and deadlines established by the host organizing committee.

Teams must provide the team swim cap for the victim.

Victims will meet all Canadian Lifeguard Championship eligibility requirements. (See 3.1 Eligibility and Right to Participate in the *Canadian Competition Manual*.)

The victims provided will not be a member of any team competing in the championships or a championship official who could determine the outcome of an event.

Victim selection shall be determined by draw. The draw shall be conducted by competition officials and the results supplied to Line Throw competitors on the day of the event.

Victim selection and victim performance are not subject to protest or appeal.

Masters division

1. Masters competitors may enter Canadian championships as individuals or as members of team. There is no maximum number of competitors per team. Competitors may compete for only one club or affiliate. (See 3.1 Eligibility and Right to Participate in the *Canadian Competition Manual*.)

Masters registered in the championship as individuals may enter the Line Throw event. The single male or female competitor may request a victim be provided by the host organizing committee.

Individuals who require this service must make this known when registering prior to the championship, in accordance with the procedures and deadlines established by the host organizing committee.

The Line Throw competitor must provide the victim's swim cap.

The victims provided will meet all Masters championship eligibility requirements.

The victims provided will not be a member of any team competing in the championships or a championship official who could determine the outcome of an event.

Victim selection shall be conducted by competition officials and the result supplied to competitors at the championship on the day of the event.

Victim selection and victim performance are not subject to protest or appeal.
