2008 JUNIOR LIFEGUARD COMPETITION - WATERFRONT

Date: August 2, 2008

Location: Rissers Beach, Nova Scotia

Eligibility: All competitors must;

- Hold a Lifesaving Society Award OR be registered in a Junior Guard Club.
- Meet the Lifesaving Society's Swim to Survive Standard (roll entry, tread water for one minute and swim 50m)
- Be at least seven years of age, and less than sixteen years of age.

Age Groups: Four Categories; 7 to 9 years, 10 and 11 years, 12 and 13 years, 14 and 15 years

Competition: The competition is approved and the events are sanctioned by the Lifesaving Society of Nova Scotia. See www.lifesavingsociety.ns.ca, click on Competition and Junior Competition for more details.

Events: Beach Run, Rescue Tube Race, Board Race, Canadian Iron Guard, Beach Flags

Entry Deadline: Entries must be received by Tuesday, July 29th at 5 pm. On site registration will be received on August 2nd with a ten dollar late fee. Refunds will not be issued for competitors who do not compete.

NATIONAL DROWNING PREVENTION WEEK

Premier Declares July 19-27 Drowning Prevention Week

Premier Rodney MacDonald declared July 19-27 Drowning Prevention Week in Nova Scotia.

"During the height of summer, many Nova Scotians seek refuge from the heat at the beach or lake," said Premier MacDonald. "By raising awareness about water safety this week, I hope we can prevent tragic drowning accidents in our province."

Drowning is the third leading cause of unintentional death for Canadians under the age of 60. It is estimated to claim 400 victims each year. More than 75 percent of drownings occur in natural bodies of water such as rivers, lakes and oceans.

"Drowning Prevention Week is the perfect time to remind Nova Scotians of a few simple water safety rules," said Krista Elvidge, president of the Nova Scotia Lifesaving Society. "By wearing a life jacket when you're in or near water and by keeping children near, Nova Scotians can avoid tragedy this summer."
